Although generously sized, with a basement and converted loft, the layout was typical of an Edwardian house, with a warren of dark rooms that didn't work for modern life. The clients were keen for the family to be able to enjoy the whole house all of the time. Zulufish have implemented a new layout and opened up the ground floor, moving the kitchen from the middle to the back of the house to make it the hub of the home, with Crittal glass doors to connect the garden. The former kitchen has become a cosy TV room. A deep ultramarine shade was chosen for the kitchen cabinetry, and then carried through into the dining area, hallway and sitting room in the form of bold artworks, striking tiles and sumptuous upholstery.
